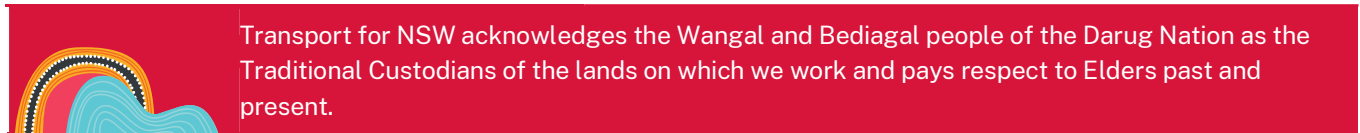


Shared bike parking at Canterbury Station

Have Your Say

Transport for NSW is providing shared bike parking at Canterbury Station to support increasing shared bike use when the new Southwest Metro opens.

Transport is proposing to install dedicated shared bike parking areas in two locations on Charles and Broughton streets.

These areas will provide parking for approximately 6 shared bikes at each location.

What are shared bike parking areas?

Shared bike parking areas are marked spaces, either on footpaths or on the road, that restrict where people can pick up and return shared bikes. Shared bike operators direct riders to park in these areas when ending their trip.

The parking areas are similar in size to a car parking space, approximately 5 to 6 metres long by 1.8 metres wide and are identified by line marking, with signage and protective barriers provided where suitable.

Why are they needed at Canterbury Station?

Shared bikes will continue to be a popular and convenient way for people to get to and from the new Metro station.

Dedicated parking areas will provide convenient parking for riders travelling from different directions and help keep station entrances, footpaths and public spaces clear for pedestrians, wheelchair users and people with prams.

Where will they be installed?

Shared bike parking areas are proposed in two locations around Canterbury Station.

Charles Street, next to the commuter carpark:

- Convert 3 metres of the existing bike parking to shared bike parking. The remaining 3 metres will continue to be available for public bike parking.

Broughton Street, north of Canterbury Road:

- In the landscaped area next to the existing bike parking on the western side of the street.

What will this mean for you?

Some construction work will be required to install the shared bike parking areas, including:

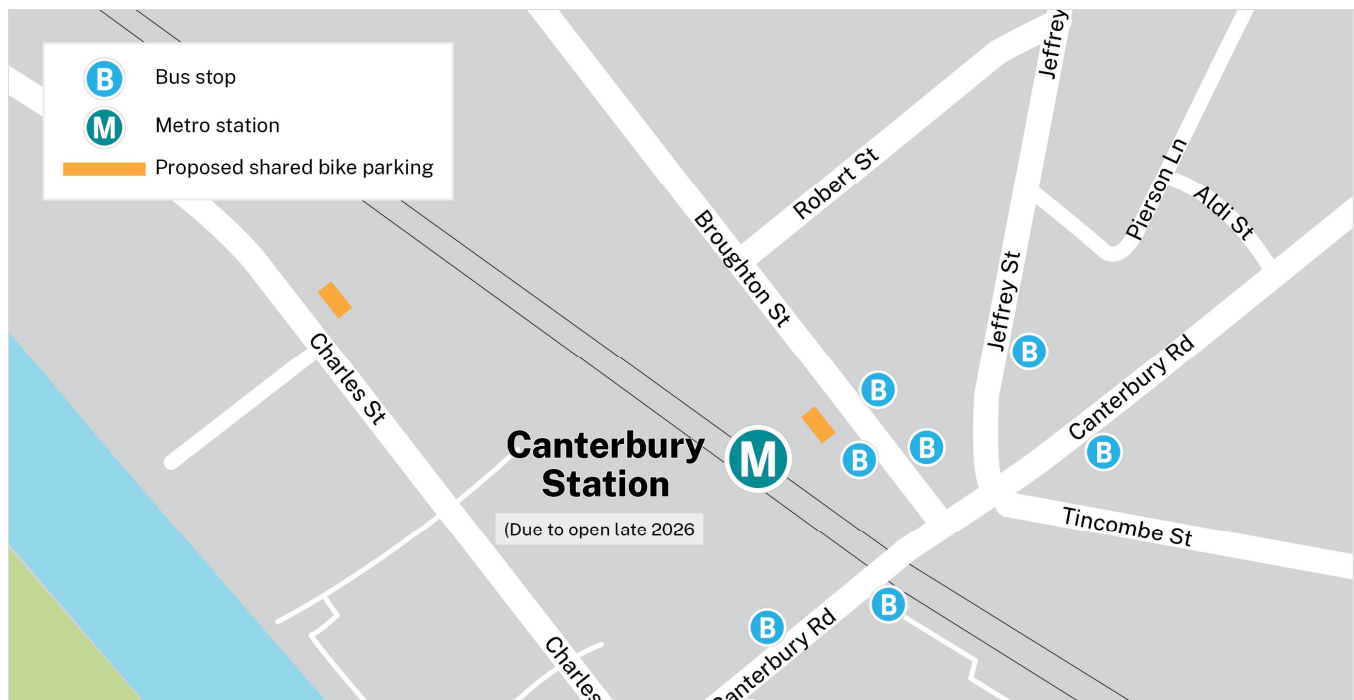
- Concreting and removing some grass and vegetation.
- Installing line marking to clearly indicate the shared bike parking areas.
